Minutes of Last Meeting - April 2019

David Philip advised that only Elected Members would be required to vote and at this point those attending (Councillor Carl John, Alan Wright, Ray Kirk, Bill Mackie (Wilkieston Resident) Aaron Mackie (Wilkieston Resident), Michelle Herron (East Calder Resident)) left the room.

David Philip confirmed to the Elected Members that as detailed in the 2015 Community Council Guidance Notes and 2015 Scheme for the Establishment of Community Councils in West Lothian (link to website emailed with the May Agenda on 18 April 2019) that for Bill Mackie to be Co-Opted would require two thirds (i.e. 5 votes)

At this point David Philip asked the Elected Members and vote was -

Against - 5

Chris Davidson advised those attending they could come back into the room.

David Philip confirmed that Bill Mackie had been unsuccessful on this occasion however was welcome to stay tonight and attend any future meetings but wouldn't have voting rights. The next Community Council elections are in two and a half years.

PLEASE NOTE - it has since been brought to the attention of the Community Council that Bill Mackie had left his mobile recording the Elected Members Co-Opting vote whilst out the room.

Matters Arising -

Joint Forum - David Philip provided an update from the meeting on Friday 3 May at the Civic Centre.

Graham Hope said the Council are considering our formal recognition of the Joint Forum to give us full voting rights on all valid topics.

Willie Clark from the Neighbourhood Watch gave a very helpful update. David asked him to come along to one of our meetings to give some hints and tips for our residents to minimise crime using local intelligence. Willie agreed to come along so we will be aiming for the August meeting collaboratively with Kirknewton, Mid Calder & Pumpherston.

June McClung from the Airport Noise Advisory Board gave an update. Herself and Louise McIntyre the Airport Engagement Officer are also going to come along to a meeting to give us another update and help us with regards to the flight path/noise etc. They are looking for people who are happy to have noise monitoring equipment in their gardens - David suggested many people in Calderwood would be happy. We held 4 seminars (twice) so people could attend 2 of the following seminars and help to form the sub committees for:

Councillor's Reports -

Councillor Carl John Update -

LAC Meeting - The four Councillor's are happy for the Community Councillor's to attend the LAC meeting.

Helicopters over the last few weeks - missing person, missing car and an aerial survey over Calderwood / Raw Holdings.

Gliding School - has commenced and now covers the whole of Scotland and Ireland.

Applications received - Bellway 105/120 houses, 6 houses and 3 plots of land at Camps (employ 40 construction/build camper vans/nursery (plants) 20 education)

St. John's - Children's Ward currently 5 days a week possibly by end of September 7 days. New additional Services - knees/ankles.

Recycling Centre - new opening hours start 27 May 2019.

Oakbank & Whitburn Monday, Wednesday & Friday 8 am to 2 pm, Saturday & Sunday 10 am to 4 pm. Closed Tuesday and Thursday.

Blackburn, Broxburn & Linlithgow - Tuesday & Thursday 8 am to 2 pm, Saturday & Sunday 10 am to 4 pm. Closed Monday, Wednesday & Friday.

There have been a couple of occasions where Oakbank Recycling Centre has had to close as traffic was backing up onto roundabout and the bins full.

There are now two Enforcement Officer's in the whole off the county for dog poo.

A report with the figures showing 6 months after the new recycling is in place will be produced.

Development Trust Kirknewton - looking at a triangular bus service a local bus company are donating a 32 seater would remove 3-4 seats from the back to accommodate bikes if required, driver training, MOT'd run 3 times serving Kirknewton, Wilkieston and East Calder for an honesty fee.

Few Road Closures over the next month for a day or so.

Pharmacy Mid Calder - Health Board have had one complaint against. With the Post Office closing Counter would be within the Pharmacy like Kirknewton.

Treasurer's Report -

East Calder Hub - The local plan has the High School on the Stirling site with funding to the Council. David Philip asked if we could do a Data Request for an Education Review and will check with Craig McCorrison, Head of Planning at the Planning Meeting on Thursday 9 May.

Kirknewton Park & Ride - Neil Lovett confirmed that he is attending Kirknewton Community Council Meeting on Tuesday 14 May at 19:30 agreed in principal that both East Calder & District and Kirknewton Community Council's talk with Stirling Developments. Stirling Developments have until the end of this month (May 2019) to appeal. Ray Kirk advised that Stirling Developments are currently looking at options -re the Park & Ride.
